Celebrate Pleasant Grove's 166th Birthday!



BE A PART OF HISTORY BE A POLL WORKER



The Utah County Elections Office is recruiting poll workers to staff the polling locations for the 2016 Presidential Election. This is a unique opportunity for Utah County residents to both serve their community and have a hands-on experience with the election process. The Presidential General Election will be on **Nov 8**. General Early Voting will be from **Oct 25 - Nov 4**. Help is needed County-wide. There is a stipend of \$150 for Poll Clerks, Early Voting Clerks receive \$10 per hour, Poll Managers will receive a stipend of \$225 and Early Voting Poll Managers receive a stipend of \$12 per hour. All Early Voting poll workers are required to work every day of Early Voting. PARKING ORDINANCE REMINDERS:

It's time for school to start again and that means many more pedestrians and vehicles on the roads. The safety of our children is top priority for all of us. Often, residents create safety hazards by parking their vehicles on city streets in such a manner that traffic flow and clear vision are either hampered or obstructed. We would like to remind residents of the parking ordinances in an effort to keep our school children safe. Most of the parking enforcement regulations can be found in Title 6 of the Pleasant Grove City Code.



6-5-1: Prohibits parking any vehicle upon a street in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than 10 feet of the width of the roadway free for vehicular traffic.

6-5-3: Prohibits overnight parking of vehicles on any city street from midnight to 8:00 a.m. from November 1st through March 15th or at any time while active snow is falling.

6-5-21: Prohibits the parking of oversized vehicles on the street in all residential and agricultural zones in the city. Vehicles for the purpose of this section are defined as trucks over 1 ½ ton capacity or licensed for more than 18,000 pounds gross, trailers, mobile homes or any other conveyance on wheels which include campers and boats. There are exceptions for active loading and unloading activities.

Thank you for not parking large vehicles including campers, trailers, and boats on the city streets in order to create a safe environment for all citizens, but particularly our school children.
