So the PG Beautification Commission, in coordination with PG Public Works and the PG City Council, has put together a Water Conservation Education and Awareness Plan to help each of us understand how we can do our part and "**Put A Stop to The Drop!**" During the next few months, there will be a campaign across PG to get the word out about this new plan. There will be flyers delivered throughout PG, a banner in the parade, a school program for elementary students on conserving water, and many other materials to help us take part in this effort. Here are just a few ideas to get us started:

To Conserve Water Indoors:

- Turning the tap off while brushing your teeth
- Making sure the dishwasher is full to run a cycle
- Consider low flow shower heads
- Fill the sink and turn off the tap while shaving
- Check all your faucets for drips
- And many more...



To Conserve Water Outdoors:

- Getting a Free Water Check at <http://beautiful.plgrove.org/schedule-free-water-check/>
- Only water your lawn as needed according to the Monthly Watering Schedule found at <http://conserve.plgrove.org>
- Consider drip irrigation to all plants and shrubs
- Include water wise, or low water usage plants in your landscaping
- And many more...

If each of us do a little more in conserving water indoors and outdoors, we can make a huge impact on how much water we use and set an example for the rest of the state of Utah. Twilight Tales: Every Tue at 6:30 pm. A wonderful weekly story hour for the whole family.


Spanish Story Time: Fri, 10:30 am. A bilingual story time for both Spanish and non-Spanish speakers.
