Pleasant Grove City Updates: Water Conservation: Included in your newsletter are some Frequently Asked Questions regarding water conservation. It answers questions regarding the watering schedule, watering recommendations, drought conditions and other things that have been asked of the City. Please review the FAQ so that you have an idea of the importance of water conservation this year. It was extremely dry this past winter, but through conservation efforts we're hoping to have enough water to last through the irrigation season. We have seen improvements in conservation and appreciate those that have taken steps to preserve this natural resource. **Economic Development:** Pleasant Grove City has been working with St. Johns Development on a project that will be visible in our community. The project area is the large property along Pleasant Grove Blvd. to the north/west as you exit I-15 and enter into Pleasant Grove. It is adjacent to the BMW Dealership and the Synergy building. The project will be a mix of office and retail development and will be a great addition to the community. The developer is working on their site plan and other approvals needed for their project. It is hopeful that they will be able to start their project in the late fall. We are excited that St. Johns Development has chosen Pleasant Grove for their project. **New Public Works Director:** **Lynn Walker** recently retired from Pleasant Grove City as the Public Works Director. We are appreciative of his service to the community. Lynn was very dedicated to his work often spending time on his off-hours making sure that our utilities were in full service. He will be missed. Pleasant Grove City hired **Marty Beaumont** as our new Public Works Director. Marty was employed by JUB Engineering and has worked for the City as our contract engineer the past 10 years. We're excited to have him aboard and we're looking forward to a bright future with him at the helm.
