### Bond Proposal for Public Safety Facilities

Pleasant Grove City Council created a Public Safety Building Committee (PSBC) about 16 months ago to consider the feasibility of building new facilities for the Police, Fire and Courts. With the help of an architect many facets were considered: Price, size, function, needs and location. The PSBC was able to recommend to the City Council the construction of the buildings with a bond of \$9.5M or less and the construction costs not to exceed \$11M of tax-payer funds.

On September 21, 2016 the PSBC and Pleasant Grove City Council unanimously voted to present these numbers to the residents of Pleasant Grove. Their joint statement includes, "By closely reviewing and restructuring this project we are convinced that all reasonable needs of our police force, fire department, and municipal court can be met within this funding level, without compromising function or service. This bond amount is 50% below the \$19M initially proposed for this project. We invite the citizens of Pleasant Grove to carefully consider this project."

While the location has yet to be determined, the residents of Pleasant Grove will be able to vote on the \$9.5M general obligation bond on Tuesday, November 8th in the General Election. With the help of bond proceeds, current funds and private donations, Pleasant Grove City hopes to build a building that will enhance the public safety of Pleasant Grove residents for many years to come.



## Tree Selection and Planting Guide

Planting and nurturing trees is a great benefit to home owners. The wide variety of trees to choose from, can be intimidating without a plan and purpose for planting specific trees. Decide what you are looking for in a tree. Do you want deep shade, filtered light, wind protection, aesthetic appeal, fall color, edible fruit, something that attracts wildlife, enhance privacy, etc? Once you have determined the purpose for planting a tree, visit the city's Beautification website at [beautiful.plgrove.org](http://beautiful.plgrove.org) for additional helpful information on tree and site selection. This website will provide greater detail on:

- Zone Hardiness – Trees do well in specific zones. There are five key planting zones and you'll want to choose trees that do well in the zones we live in.
- Soil PH – it's important to determine the PH of the soil where you intend to plant a tree.
- Tree Health Requirements – Trees have requirements for sun, shade, specific nutrients and water requirements.
- Known Disease and Pests – You should know the disease and insect pest for various types of trees and what you'll need to do to protect against disease and insects.

The fall is a great time to plant a tree. Check out the website, do your homework and happy planting!
