## 2012 GET UP AND MOVE



## Public Invited to Review 2013 Budget

Pleasant Grove City recently adopted its budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012. A document, which includes the adopted budget, is available to **view on the City's website at [plgrove.org](http://plgrove.org)**. Included with this document, is a letter from the City Administrator and a budget discussion meant to explain some of the complexities of a municipal budget. I invite everyone to take the opportunity to review this document.

Questions are often asked related to the City's finances. This document attempts to answer many of these questions. **Information related to sources of revenues, capital expenditures, and City debt are all included.** New this year, the City Council has adopted budget guidelines to assist with and maintain consistency for this and future budgets. These guidelines are included as well.



**The City's 2013 budget estimates general fund revenue of \$11,951,723 and total City revenue of \$28,551,842.** While economic conditions are still fragile, sales tax revenue, which is the City's largest source of general fund revenue, is estimated to increase 3.3% for the upcoming year. As you would likely expect, the largest portion of the City's general fund, 41 percent, will be spent on public safety. Other general fund items include streets, community development, courts, leisure services and general government.

I hope you will take advantage of the opportunity to read and learn about how Pleasant Grove City finances its operations.
