\$50 fine - Meter Tampering

A new fee was recently set by the City Council for water meter tampering. If residents for any reason open their water meter boxes, whether or not they have the intent to steal water, will be fined \$50. The City has found it necessary to discourage entrance into the City owned meter boxes. In addition to the \$50 fine for opening the box, residents who cause damage will be charged to cover repairs. The cost to replace a box is about \$135.




