WATER CONSERVATION

Resident Watering Schedule

Odd house numbers:

Monday, Wednesday, Friday

Even house numbers:

Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday

Watering NOT allowed on Sunday

Violation Penalties

If residents violate these schedules:

1st Offense: Door hanger warning.

2nd Offense: Disconnection from the system and \$50 reconnect fee.


3rd Offense: Disconnection from the system and \$200 reconnect fee. (See City Code Title 8, Chapter 8)

Although conservation plans don't recommend watering during the day, it is helpful to our system for *some* residents to water during the day. If some people don't water during the day our system over-pressurizes and we end up sending water down the ditch. There are no restrictions on the time of day.

PG City Appoints New Police Chief

Pleasant Grove City is excited to announce the appointment of a new police chief. Chief Tom Paul retired at the end of April after serving the city for 37 years. The Mayor has appointed Michael L. Smith to the position. Chief Smith has been serving as the Captain of the Pleasant Grove Police Department for the last few years. He is excited to continue the legacy of excellence established by his predecessors while bringing some fresh new ideas and programs to the department to make his own mark.



Chief Michael Smith was raised in Pleasant Grove where he attended Grove Crest Elementary, PG Jr. High, and graduated from PG High in 1989. He is married to Brenda Smith and they have five children; 2 girls and 3 boys. He is proud of his Pleasant Grove heritage and enjoys serving the residents of Pleasant Grove.

In 1994, Chief Smith began his career with the Pleasant Grove Police Department. While employed for PGPD, he has been able to serve as a patrol officer, motor officer, detective, sergeant, lieutenant, captain and now chief. In 1998, Chief Smith was selected to be a member of the newly formed Utah County Metro SWAT Team. After serving on the team for a couple of years, Chief Smith was promoted to a Team Leader and currently serves as the Forward Operations Commander on the team. Chief Smith has also served as a member of a joint criminal apprehension team with the U.S. Marshal's Office. Chief Smith holds an associate's degree in Criminal Justice and a bachelor's degree in Emergency Management.

In the summer of 2011, Chief Smith spent three months in Quantico, Virginia where he attended and graduated from the FBI National Academy.

Fireworks Update




The State Legislature has made some changes the fireworks law, including the dates and times that fireworks may be discharged. Effective this year, fireworks may only be discharged on **July 1st to July 7th** and on **July 21st to July 27th**, between the hours of 11 am and 11 pm, with the exception of the holidays July 4th and July 24th, which extends to midnight.

With the increasing threat of certain fireworks causing fires that could potentially move up the mountains east of Pleasant Grove, it became necessary for the City to restrict the discharge of aerial fireworks.

City Ordinance 4-7-2 prohibits the discharge of aerial fireworks (i.e. multiple shot cakes) in the neighborhoods of Battle Creek, Grove Creek, Big Spring and a small portion of Manila (on the east side of 100 East). The easiest way to know where not to discharge aerial fireworks is to understand that they are prohibited *east of the Murdock Canal, and east of 100 East from 1100 North to the north boundary of Pleasant Grove.*

This restriction is limited to aerial fireworks only. Other legal fireworks may still be lit, however residents are urged to use caution when lighting fireworks to avoid causing personal injury or fires. **Remember**, adult supervision is always recommended. ***Please be safe as you celebrate!***



Utility Rate Increases

Dear Pleasant Grove City Resident,

In December of 2010 Pleasant Grove City adopted a four year utility rate increase plan to budget for the ongoing infrastructure needs for the city. This plan was set to increase a residents overall utility bill by approximately \$10 per month per year for the next four years. The first two rate increases have already been implemented and on your next (July) utility bill, it will show the third step in these increases.

These rates were verified by a rate study and were essential to the financial health of the utility funds. Initially the city considered implementing the rates all at one time, but decided to implement the rates over a four year period in order to relieve some of the financial burden.

We recognize that this is a difficult time to raise rates. However the alternative for the city would be far more detrimental to the overall health of the city and its future if we chose to ignore the needed increases.
