Open Burn Window by permit

A return e-mail will verify the issuance or denial of the permit. You must have a burn permit prior to burning prunings. Secondary Water Available May 1st



The Pressurized Irrigation team is out rebuilding and repairing all the secondary facilities getting prepared for this season. As you know, snow fall was scarce and we are still waiting to find out our allotment of water for 2013. This lets us know how much water is available in the reservoirs and rivers for the season. April 10, we will begin filling the secondary water system from Battle Creek canyon and Grove Creek canyon. The C.U.P. (Provo River) will be back on line around the same time, which helps us fill the upper zones. At this time we need everyone's help to make sure their connection to the system is in the off position so as we fill the lines there won't be any flooding. This will allow us to fill the system more effectively and in less time.

The system will be filled and ready to use by May 1st

Odd number homes will water on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The even number homes will water Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. No watering on Sunday, we use this day to let the tanks refill for the new week. For water conservation tips please visit <http://conservewater.utah.gov>.


