Pleasant Grove City is pleased to present to you this year's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report! We are happy to report that our drinking water meets Federal and State requirements! 2013 Will be a Big Year for Pleasant Grove

The first half of 2013 has already been a successful start to our new year. We have seen success in various ways throughout the City. Here's a list of some of the items that we've been working on:

Economic Development- We have had a few businesses that have decided to make Pleasant Grove their home. The largest is doTERRA which has chosen to locate their world-wide headquarters in our city. We hope that we have a long and prosperous partnership as they continue to grow and expand. We also have some projects that are in the planning process and we hope that ground will be broken by the end of this year. Two of those projects include a theme park and a grocery store.

Storm Drain Detainage and Cemetery Expansion (Pipe Plant Property)- Normally these two items don't go together, but the City has purchased the old pipe plant property. This property is about 40 acres and will have two main purposes: *One will be* expansion of the cemetery. The additional property will likely give the City enough property to expand the cemetery to accommodate enough plots for the foreseeable future.

The second purpose of the property would be to detain storm water. In conjunction with this we'll look at creating a landscaped park. There is not a timeline for the park due to funding, nor have all the elements of the park been decided. But, the property has been obtained for future development by Pleasant Grove City.

Public Safety Facilities- The City is pursuing a new Fire and Police Station. Our current facilities are outdated and out of space. Our growing city needs new facilities to accommodate these growing departments. There are concerns over whether there is a need for new facilities, but we would invite you to come and tour our current facilities to allow you to see what the issues are. A tour schedule will be released in early July with times for the public to come and see each building. Building these new facilities will likely incur a property tax increase. The City will have *a public hearing on this issue on Wednesday, August 7th at 6:00 p.m. at the Fire Station.* We invite all to come and share their feelings on this issue.

Utility Rate Increase



Pleasant Grove City will have new utility rates starting with your July billing. This increase is a result of a rate study done three years ago. From that study the City implemented a four year rate increase to stabilize revenues for the city's infrastructure. July 1, 2013 will be the last of these increases for this rate study. Each year has seen about a \$10 per month increase in utilities, but this year the increase will be roughly \$7 per month due to not needing to implement the scheduled sewer rate increase. However, each subsequent year, Pleasant Grove City will review their utility rates. It is likely that incremental increases in utility rates will be needed each year so that we can keep up with increasing infrastructure costs.
