Legal Department News: Introducing Summer Shelton



My name is Summer Shelton and I am the new full-time city prosecutor. My job is to prosecute misdemeanor criminal offenses that are committed in Pleasant Grove. Most of my duties involve prosecution of Class B and C misdemeanors and infractions in the Pleasant Grove Justice Court. Those cases may involve anything from minor traffic violations to driving under the influence, theft or domestic violence assault cases. I also prosecute Class A misdemeanors in the American Fork District Court involving more serious offenses such as protective order violations, aggravated assaults or serious drug charges.

I spent the previous two years working for a law firm in Salt Lake County that provides prosecution services to several smaller cities throughout the state. I was assigned to the Draper Justice Court and developed a great relationship with members of the public, victims of crimes, law enforcement and even defendants. Prior to becoming a prosecutor, I was a criminal defense attorney for nearly ten years. I represented defendants in felony and misdemeanor matters in both state and federal courts throughout Utah. My experience as a defense attorney provides me with the unique ability to evaluate a case and see the strengths and weaknesses and work with law enforcement and victims to ensure justice is served.

As the new city prosecutor, I am committed to serving the people who work, live and raise their families in Pleasant Grove. I look forward to working with the community as I seek justice and pledge to provide zealous representation for the city and especially individual victims of crime. ~ *Summer Shelton City Prosecutor*




