Public Safety Building Budget 2016

Highly Summarized Public Safety Building Budget 2016*

* During design phase if bond approved
 ** Commitments if bond is approved
 Created by Team of PSB Committee, Council, Staff,
 and THINK Architecture.



Estimated cost: Both buildings. Either site.
 Contingencies: Margin for errors, unforeseen issues, and change orders. Team removed this number as it invites additional cost. It will be reduced/eliminated by diligent upfront planning and minimal backend changes. Estimate drops to \$11.4M.
 *Space savings: During initial analysis of floor and site plans, Team shifted space from a hall into adjacent work area. Further refinement of designs will eliminate more square feet, enhance work flow, and reduce cost. Estimate drops to \$11M.
 Construction: \$11M "sticks & bricks" estimate. Team compromised and agreed as achievable.
 Impact fees: Money already collected from public safety impact fees, sale of land originally purchased using public safety impact fees, and saved for this project. Estimated borrowed amount drops to \$10M.
 *Value engineering: An architect, engineer, general contractor, and owner's representative use combined expertise to reduce costs during construction. Estimated drops to \$9.5M.
 Bond: Maximum to be borrowed. Agreed by the Team as \$9.5M.
 **Donations: Donor representatives met with Team & offered financial support for items ranging from; quality of materials in exterior finishes, furnishings/fixtures/equipment (ff&e), landscaping, or simply to reduce the amount borrowed and reduce the burden on the citizens. Choice on how donations are used rests first with the donors. Current estimate is \$2.25M.
 The PSB Committee, Council, Staff, & Architect labored for 18 months to minimize the proposed bond. \$9.5M is 50% less than the 2013 bond proposal. **Please vote on Tuesday November 8, 2016.**
