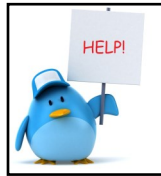
Help Us Update the City's Future Plan

LITERACY CENTER

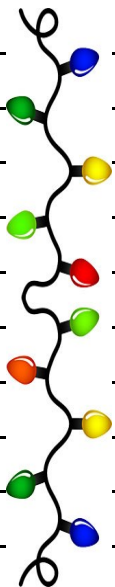

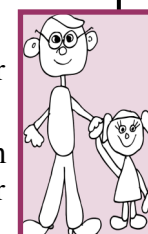
