A TIME FOR GRATITUDE

On November 12, 2008, the Supreme Court heard oral arguments in Pleasant Grove vs. Summum (07-665). The story has been picked up thousands of times by various newspapers, television, radio and internet publications around the world. The transcript of the event is 80 pages long and took approximately 1 hour of the Court's time. We express our gratitude to Jay Sekulow of the American Center for Law & Justice (ACLJ), who took this case pro-bono (no cost to the city). ACLJ is a non-profit organization funded through donations. My son texted me a message after the hearing and asked, "When will you get the results?" I indicated, "probably late spring." He asked, "Why so long?" I responded, "when you get nine people together with extremely different perspectives to make a decision on something that will affect every government entity in the United States for decades to come...a few months isn't really that much to ask." He agreed.

The battle is not over yet. Even when the Supreme Court announces their decision, there will be issues to deal with. Someone, somewhere will not like the decision and the fight will rage on. It is good to know there are people like Mr. Sekulow and the ACLJ who are willing and able to defend our rights. We need to support those who support us.

As we approach this season of celebrations, let us pause and be grateful for the liberties and freedoms we enjoy in this great country. The laws that grant us the rights we have as a majority also protect the minority. Sometimes we are in the majority. Sometimes we are in the minority. Either way, it is our Constitution and our willingness to live by it that keeps our rights in tact.

We are at war. We are experiencing turbulent economic times. There are big changes coming in our federal government next year. We've faced challenging times before. Hopefully we've learned from those experiences and can weather these times better than in the past. Together, we can

face these challenges and win.

Reach out to those around you. Help those that are less fortunate. Invite someone over to share your fire and bread. It is time to take care of each other. The sun will rise and set each day. It shines upon everyone no matter what their individual circumstances or affiliations may be. Let's be like sunshine and reach out to everyone. HEAT PROGRAM NOW OPEN

Community Action Services and Food Bank is now accepting applications for the HEAT program, a program which assists low-income households in making utility payments through the winter season. A one-time payment per year will be submitted directly to utility companies for individuals who qualify. Disbursements are based on income. All Utah County residents interested in applying must call 801-373-8200 from now until the end of April for an appointment. Low-income households and those with disabilities are especially encouraged to apply. Applicants must meet income guidelines and provide all required documentation. Homebound individuals may request an Outreach worker to come to their home to assist in the application process. Firsttime applicants in Utah County must complete an energy education class as part of the process (energy class is waived for disabled or elderly applicants).

SIDEWALKS BLOCKED: Please prune trees, shrubs and weeds from over the sidewalk. Children are walking to school are being forced into the roadway and are not able to stay on the sidewalks. City Code requires that folage be pruned to eight (8) feet above the sidewalk and sixteen (16) feet above the roadway.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO DELIVER MEALS-ON-WHEELS IN P.G.

Meals-on-Wheels needs volunteer drivers one day a week, for one hour, in a limited delivery radius. Volunteers give up one lunch hour, once a week to help feed hungry seniors.

Volunteer drivers are the people who actually deliver the meals to elderly, ill, frail, or disabled seniors in their homes. Volunteers use their own vehicles to deliver meals dropped off at the senior center. The individual meals are packed in hot and cold food containers on a rolling cart.

The Meals-on-Wheels volunteer routes consist of 8 to 11 meals in a four to five mile radius from the Pleasant Grove Jacobs Senior Center, 242 West 200 South, Pleasant Grove. Each route needs a minimum of 7 volunteers one for each day of the week and two substitutes. It takes about ${\hat A}^{1\!/}_{2}$ hour to 1 hour to complete the delivery. Meals are delivered between 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Please consider volunteering for one hour, once a week or as a back-up substitute.
