Secondary Water Ending Early

The secondary water system will be **shut down starting October 1st**. Due to the upcoming work to enclose the Murdock Canal, water will not be delivered in the canal after the first of the month. This will require the City to begin the winter shut down of the secondary water system two weeks earlier than normal. Residents should plan to winterize their sprinkler systems after the beginning of the month. As during spring start-up, there may be water in some portions of the system for several weeks as the main lines are drained.

Bike Lanes are Coming to Pleasant Grove

Bike lanes are shown in the City's Transportation Master Plan for the major streets. These streets are currently being reviewed for the installation of these lanes. There may be some changes to on-street parking with the striping of bike lanes. The few blocks in the downtown area where bike lanes have been painted are expected to be extended into a useful network providing bicyclists with a safer trip on our major streets.

Watch for a City Council meeting where the bike lanes and associated changes will be discussed. Public input on these changes is welcomed.

Fall Leaves

As we go into the fall, remember that leaves and other autumn debris are not to be swept or blown into the street. Residents are responsible to keep the sidewalks and gutters in front of their homes clean. Debris in the gutters are a major source of blockages in the storm drain system which lead to flooding problems.

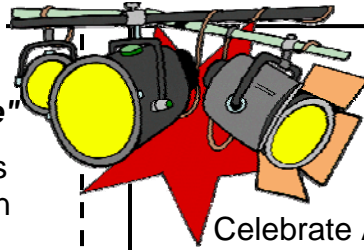
