

## MAYOR CALL'S MESSAGE

Let me bring our citizens up to date on a few things. We have three hot topics these days, and it's probably best that you hear the status on these from the mayor.

**Sewage Treatment Plant.** The Timpanogos Special Service District (TSSD) operates a sewage treatment plant in the southeast corner of American Fork, just west of Pleasant Grove's freeway exit. Part of that treatment is composting, in which sewage sludge is mixed with green waste. There are times when the stench from the onsite composting is unbearable. Many of our citizens have experienced that in the past, and it seems to have worsened during this winter.

TSSD recognizes the problems the odor creates, and they have taken steps to reduce the smell. They are now turning the sludge less often, which means the odor isn't constant. They are also investing \$5 million in a covering system that is touted to reduce odor up to 97%. This system is scheduled to be in place and operating this summer.

While Pleasant Grove City appreciates the efforts that TSSD is making, we are disappointed that they haven't seriously considered the one alternative that guarantees no composting odors: taking the composting offsite, or eliminating composting altogether. When that option has been presented, the board of directors (comprised of representatives from north county communities) has immediately dismissed it because of cost. Some board members have even stated that the smell doesn't affect their citizens, and so they don't want their residents to pay more for a service that only benefits Pleasant Grove. As you can imagine, it is very disappointing to hear that our neighbors who contribute to the problem don't feel an obligation to help with the solution.

Pleasant Grove's official position is that while we appreciate anything that can be done to reduce or minimize the stench, we advocate the only surefire way to eliminate composting odors: take it offsite. If you want to make your voice heard on this issue, please call the TSSD at 801.756.5231.

**Recycling.** Pleasant Grove's curbside recycling program will begin shortly. The opt-out period ended some weeks ago; this allowed the city to give final subscriber numbers to Allied Waste. Allied is now ordering the recycling containers and will deliver them to homes in late May or early June, along with specifics on pick-up days. Please look forward to that.

**Accessory Apartments.** An accessory apartment is a portion of a home in a single family residential zone that is rented out to a non-family member or a caretaker. Accessory apartments have never been legal in Pleasant Grove. Recently, the city council reaffirmed the non-legal status of accessory apartments. In doing this, we recognized that there are many such apartments already in Pleasant Grove, often owned by people who didn't know they were illegal.

The city's position on accessory apartments is this: First, no new accessory apartments will be allowed. If the Code Enforcement office learns of a new accessory apartment, they will take steps to shut it down. Second, existing accessory apartments will be allowed to continue for as long as the homeowner owns the house. Once a house with an accessory apartment is sold, the apartment must go. In this way, existing apartment owners are not immediately disadvantaged, while the shape of the community will gradually move toward true single family dwellings in single family zones.

I hope this clarifies some of the issues for you. We have a wonderful community, and every step we take as elected officials and employees is a commitment to make our city even better.

The article stated that residents are to water on odd or even dates, depending on their address number. **That is incorrect at this time.**

Please read this corrected information from the water department: In order for us to operate the system more efficiently, until the final tank is completed, we are asking you to help balance the system by following a watering schedule. This requires watering during the day as well as at night. We recognize that watering during the day is less efficient, but it is necessary to better balance water use with supply. Please remember that we only water 6 days a week, Monday through Saturday and no watering on Sunday. Please help with the continuing effort to conserve water! The city's responsibility ends at the city valve. If you have any questions please call the Public Works Office at 801-785-2941.

That was 50 years ago, and it did become an annual affair. The date for the "fireman's breakfast" has vacillated through the years within the month of May. Two years ago, I moved it back to the last Saturday in May in hopes of having better weather. It seems to be working - we've had pretty good luck so far.

We still serve the same food from 50 years ago. Ok, not the same food, but the menu has not changed much over the years. We still serve a "hot off the grill" Ham, Eggs, Pancakes, and Hash-brown Potatoes breakfast that is cooked by fire fighters. The last few years, we modified and re-organized the ticketing process, thereby reducing wait times. And, we set up every table and chair we can find to accommodate as many as we can. It may seem crowded, but it's not, it's cozy. Besides, we're all neighbors and when food tastes this good, no one cares.

Come and join us as we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the Annual Fireman's Breakfast. This year's breakfast is scheduled for May 29, 2010. We begin serving at 6:00 am and shut things down at 11:00 am. Tickets are \$5.00 for everyone. Pre-buy tickets at the station beginning May 10th or get them at the door on the morning of the breakfast.

We don't do this for the money, we do it because it gives us a chance to get to know you.

I hope to see you there.

Last year, on the second Saturday of June, 2009, twenty eight Pleasant Grove firefighters and family members ran the Utah Valley Marathon. ## RESIDENTIAL SOLICITATION REGULATIONS

### (DOOR TO DOOR SALES)

We are entering the time of year when solicitors will be visiting our community. All residents are urged to exercise caution with solicitors who may be canvassing the city. As you may be aware, the City Council has passed an ordinance regulating solicitors which protect the rights of the residents and solicitors. Under the provisions of this ordinance, a company is required to obtain a solicitor's license from Pleasant Grove City to work in the city. Solicitors are also required to provide a recent criminal background check. Each solicitor has an ID badge to wear that is issued by the City. If a solicitor comes to your door they should display the identification badge. If the badge is not presented, the Police Department recommends you decline to do business and call them at 801-785-3506.

Ensuring that you see the City-issued solicitor identification before engaging in conversation will help with safety issues. To prohibit door-to-door sales at your residence, please post a "No Soliciting" sign at the

door. Per City code, by displaying this sign which 'shall be posted on or near the main entrance door or on or near the property line adjacent to the sidewalk leading to the residence, constitutes to any solicitor that the inhabitant of the residence does not desire to receive and/or does not invite solicitors.' If such a sign is posted, it is a violation of the ordinance for any solicitor to engage or attempt to engage in door-to-door solicitation. (Chap.3-15-17, 18)

In the same regard, it is unlawful to distribute or post any handbills or circulars without first obtaining a permit. A license will then be issued and an identification badge should be displayed by those distributing. To prohibit the posting of materials at your residence, a resident would want to post in a conspicuous position near the entrance a sign bearing the words: "No Trespassing", "No Peddlers or Agents", "No Advertisements", or any similar notice indicating in any manner that the occupants of the premise do not desire to have their right of privacy disturbed, or to have any such handbills left upon such premises.
