GENERAL ELECTIONS RESULTS

OFFICIAL RESULTS OF THE NOV 7 GENERAL ELECTION

A canvass of the general election results was conducted at a special meeting of the City Council on November 21, 2017. The canvass was based on election data received from the Utah County Clerk's Office, which administered the city's all vote-by-mail election. The purpose of the canvass is to account for every ballot cast and ensure that every valid vote is included in the election totals.

We congratulate Guy Fugal as being elected to a four year term as Mayor of Pleasant Grove City and Dianna Andersen as being re-elected to a four year term on the City Council. We would also like to congratulate and welcome Todd Williams to a four-year term on the City Council.

Proposition #3 enacting an ordinance requiring the transfer of \$2,625,000.00 out of the General Fund Budget to fund road repair and maintenance as the primary budget priority received more NO (Against) votes and was therefore REJECTED by the voters.

- Turn off the outdoor water supply and drain taps before the first freeze.
- Insulate pipes that are most susceptible to freezing, especially near outer walls, crawl spaces, and the attic.
- Place mulch at least 3 inches deep around all of your plants to retain moisture and regulate soil temperature.
