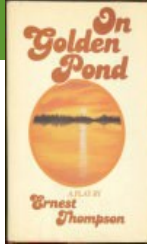

BE WATER WISE



Here are 3 examples of our "water wise" tips:

- Install a drip or other water conservation irrigation systems and save up to 60% of all water used in garden care.
- Shelter container plants. Move to shadier areas to keep them from drying quickly in hot, windy areas.
- Turn off lawn sprinklers before water is wasted as run-off. Keep your system working properly.
