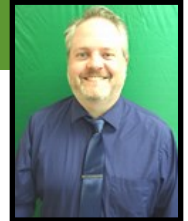

### Meet Michael Scott, City Prosecutor



Hello, my name is Michael Scott (yes, just like The Office) and I've joined Pleasant Grove as the City Prosecutor. I'm responsible for prosecuting all misdemeanors that occur in the city. For those who may not know, misdemeanors cover everything from minor traffic violations to more serious offenses like DUI and Domestic Violence. SafeWise recently named Pleasant Grove the fifth safest city in Utah, which is outstanding! Misdemeanor prosecution is an important component in keeping the residents of the city safe and I'm excited to be a part of that and help continue the city's reputation for safety.

As a bit of background, I got my law degree from Emory University in Atlanta and have been a lawyer since 2004. I've been a prosecutor for South Salt Lake and West Jordan. Prior to joining Pleasant Grove I worked for Lokken and Associates in Salt Lake City as a private attorney specializing in child welfare defense.

I also spent two years as an Assistant Professor in Justice Studies at Westminster College where I taught classes including criminology, criminal law and procedure, and constitutional and civil rights law. I value citizen contact, and understand the importance of being available to those who need help in the system. As a prosecutor I can't give legal advice, but I am always willing to meet with a victim, a witness or just a citizen who wants to know about how the system works. I am more than happy to set up a meeting time with anyone who wants to better understand prosecution in the city.
